

Alternative Sewer Collection System

Your home uses a solids interceptor tank and/or effluent pump system for connecting to NCWSA’s sanitary sewer. While the systems are not always identical, your system is similar to the one pictured below. You are responsible for facilitating maintenance of any piping, tanks, pumps or controls located in your yard between the house and the service connection at the street. Residuals Management Program (Sludge)

Action Required

The South Carolina Department of Environmental Services (SCDES) requires clean-out of sludge from your solids interceptor tank and/or pump basin once every five years. **To comply, you must provide a record of the clean-out dated no earlier than January 1, 2022, or have your tank(s) cleaned and provide a record no later than December 31, 2026. Failure to comply will result in enforcement action up to and including termination of service.** For homes constructed after January 1, 2022, you should submit the date of occupancy; no clean-out is required. Records can be hand-delivered, mailed or emailed to customer.service@newberrycountywsa.com. Please make sure your service address is clearly stated.
